This venue will provide our retreatants with a peaceful setting and warm hospitality. All facilities are wheelchair accessible.



The Beginnings

In 1968 Jean Vanier agreed to give a retreat in Toronto, but insisted that it be open to all people: rich and poor, young and old, married and single. He especially wanted to welcome an array of abilities. Jean believed in creating a community in retreat by inviting people to share from their hearts. And so, Faith and Sharing was born.

In 1969, Father Jim O'Donnell went to Canada to participate in the second Faith and Sharing Retreat. It changed his life. Three years later, Jean Vanier and Fr. Jim inaugurated the retreat in Cleveland.

What is Faith and Sharing?

Faith and Sharing is an encounter with the Body of Christ in all its many gifts, dreams, and abilities. Faith and Sharing is a community with whom you can explore the invitation of the Gospel. It begins with a four-day experience, but it grows into a way of life.

The Weekend

"Who are you, Jesus?" Our animator has been distracted by this question of late and she is eager to share her thoughts with us. Our best preparation for our days together would be for us to wrestle with that question ourselves! Pray. Read the Word. Listen. Make notes. And come share with us what has been revealed to you.

The Animator

Born in Akron, Ohio, Sr. Sue Mosteller received most of her education from the Sisters of St. Joseph in Toronto. She entered the Congregation of St. Joseph after high school, taught school and was principal, in British Columbia and Ontario for fifteen years, during which time she completed her degree in English at the University of Toronto.

In 1967 she met Jean Vanier who called her to organize and preach Faith and Sharing Retreats in Canada and abroad. Through Jean Vanier's inspiration, Sue became interested in the plight of persons with a disability, and she helped to organize a Faith and Light pilgrimage to Lourdes in 1971 where five hundred families and young people from the Americas participated with 14,000 other pilgrims from other countries.

From there she moved to the L'Arche Daybreak Community in Richmond Hill where she lived in community with people with disabilities for 40 years. Sue followed Jean Vanier as the International

Coordinator of L'Arche and traveled widely, experienced other cultures and religions, and assisted in birthing new L'Arche communities worldwide.

With Father Henri J. M. Nouwen, Daybreak's pastor, Sue opened "Dayspring," a small spiritual center for spiritual growth. Dayspring offers silence, occasional retreats, and workshops focusing on the spiritual life.

LIGHT

Sue published three books; the latest is "Light Through the Crack." (2006)

When Henri Nouwen died in September 1996, Sue was named Executrix of his Literary Estate. She is presently working with the published and unpublished legacy of Henri Nouwen, giving retreats and workshops, and enjoying her retirement with the Sisters of her Congregation in a convent in downtown Toronto.
